



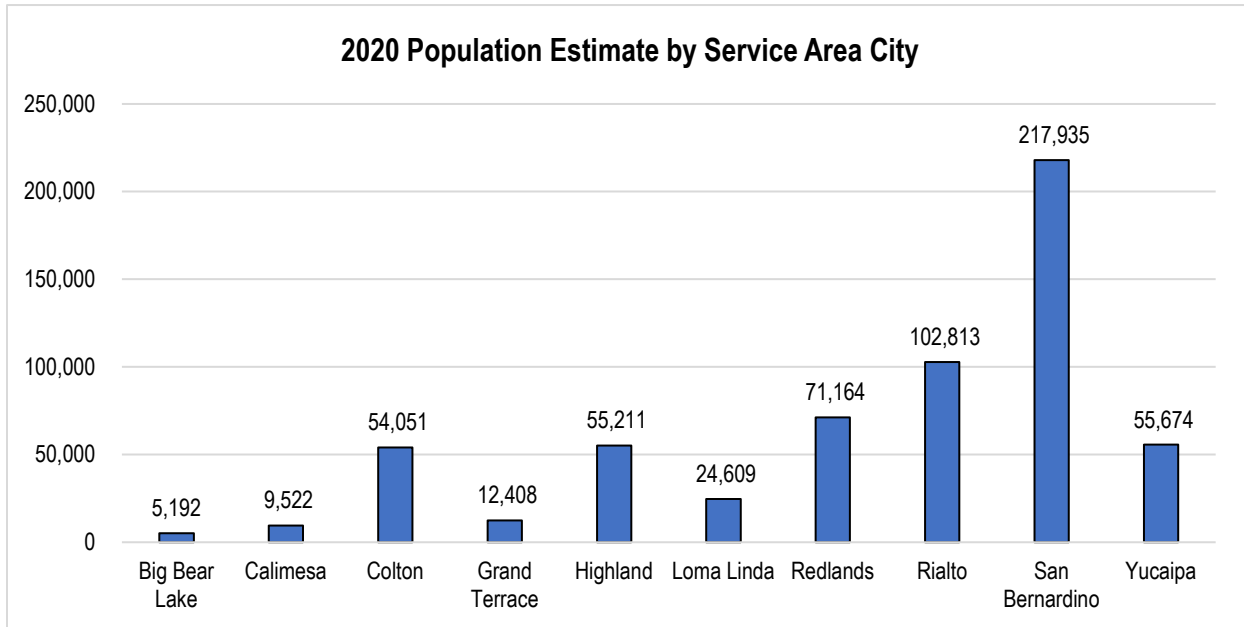

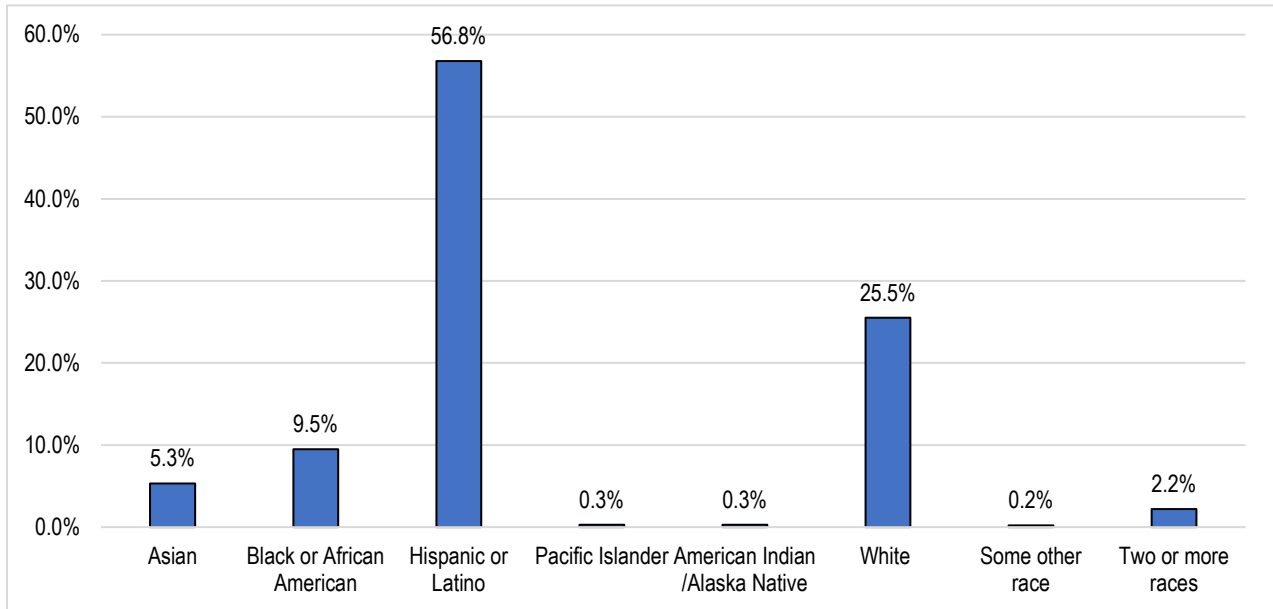

The San Bernardino Community College District service area represents 27.7% of the total San Bernardino County population. The top 3 cities – San Bernardino, Rialto, and Redlands represent about 64.5% of the service area population. The service area population grew by 1.0 percent to 603,387 between 2016 and 2020. Service area cities with the largest numeric growth were Yucaipa (+1,363) and San Bernardino (+1,290). Fastest growing service area cities are Calimesa (11.6%), Yucaipa (2.5%), and Loma Linda (2.2%).

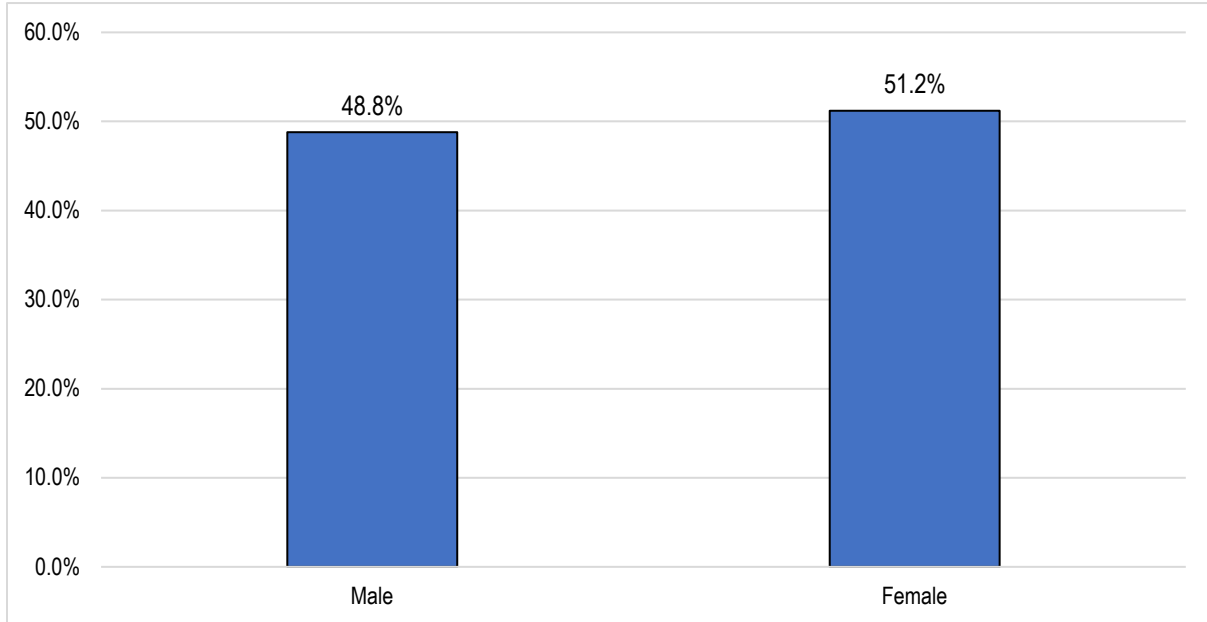

Ethnically, the population of the SBCCD service area cities is 56.8% Hispanic, 25.5% White, 9.5% African American, 5.3% Asian, 2.2% Two or More Race, 0.3% American Indians/Alaska Natives, 0.3% Pacific Islander, and 0.2% Some other race. In Colton, Rialto, and San Bernardino, more than 60% of the residents are Hispanic. In Big Bear Lake, and Calimesa, more than 60% of the residents are White. In Loma Linda, 24% of the residents are Asian.

**Gender Distribution : 2019**

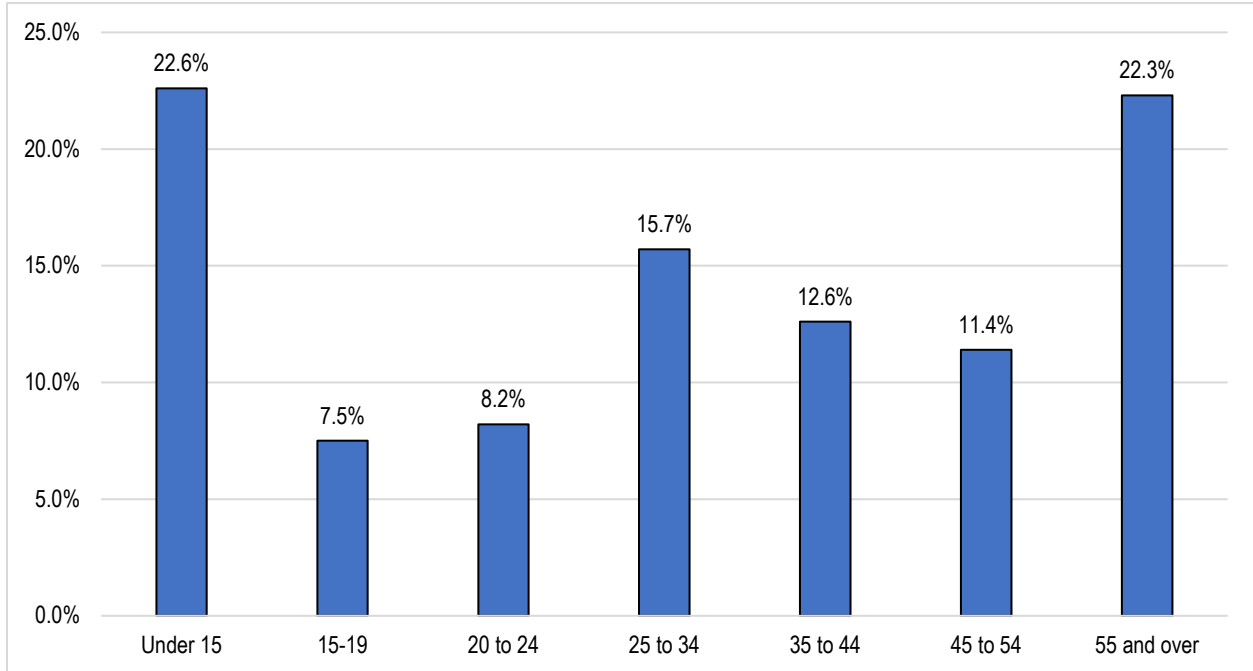

Currently, 51.2 percent of the SBCCD service area’s population is female and 48.8 percent is male. In 5 cities, there is a slightly higher number of females than males. The service area city with the largest female population is Loma Linda (55.0%), followed by Colton(53.0%), Grand Terrace (52.5%), Redlands (52.2%), and Yucaipa (51.4%).

**Age Range Distribution: 2019**



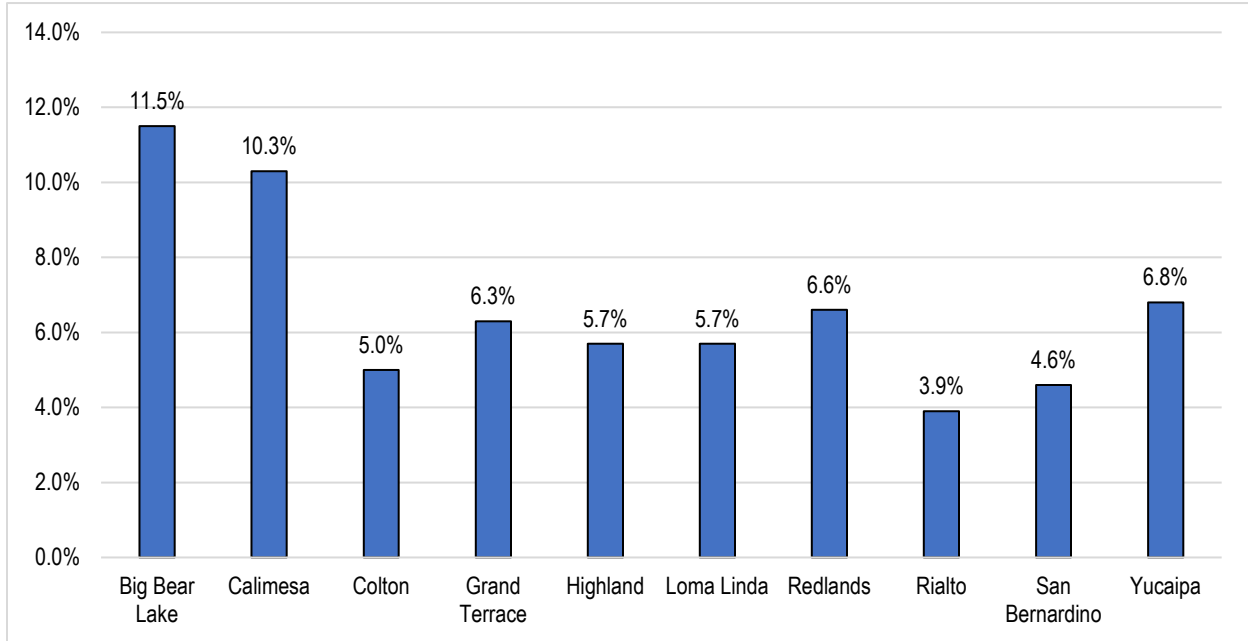

The two largest age groups in the SBCCD’s service Area cities are residents under 15 years of age (22.6%) and residents 55 years of age or older (22.3%). Together these ages groups make up nearly 44.9% of the service area population. The median age in the SBCCD service area population is 33.1 years old, which is similar to the county’s median age.

The median age in Calimesa is the highest in the service area at 48.0 years. Big Bear’s median age of 43.7 years is the next highest. San Bernardino had the lowest median age (29.9 years), followed by Rialto (30.5 years).

**Veteran Status - Civilian Population 18 Years and Over: 2019**

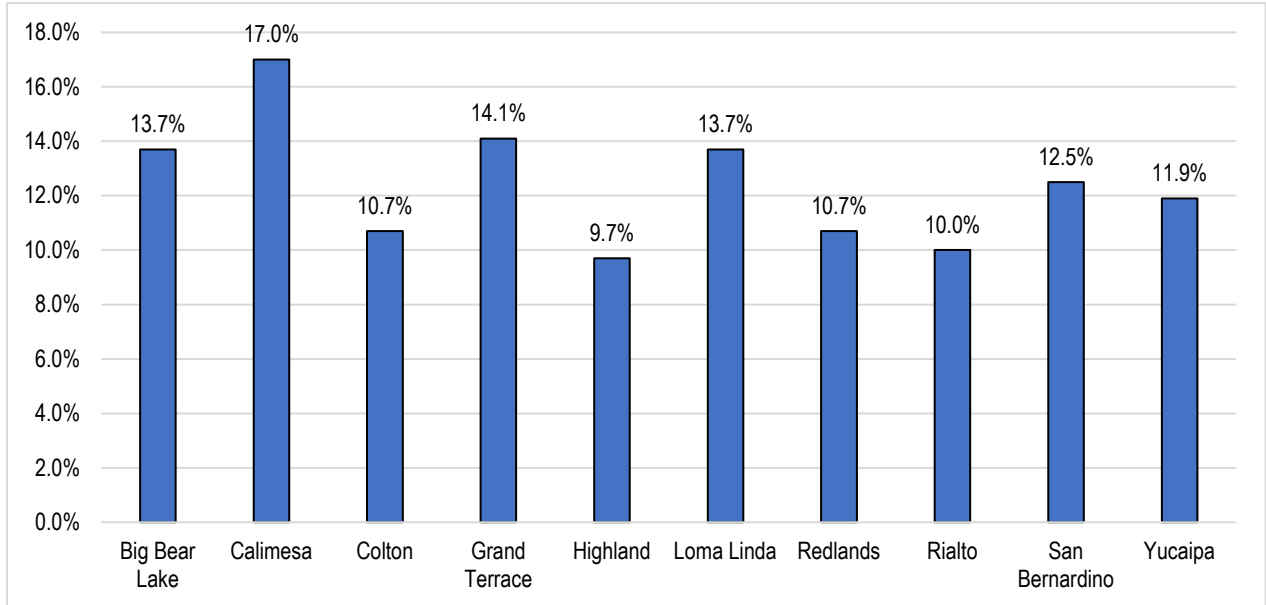

Among the civilian population 18 years and older, 5.3 percent of the service area population are veterans, which is lower than the state’s percentage. The service area city with the highest percentage of veterans is Big Bear Lake (11.5%). Calimesa (10.3%), Yucaipa (6.8%), Redlands (6.6%), and Grand Terrace (6.3%) follow.

**Disability Status - Civilian Noninstitutionalized Population: 2019**



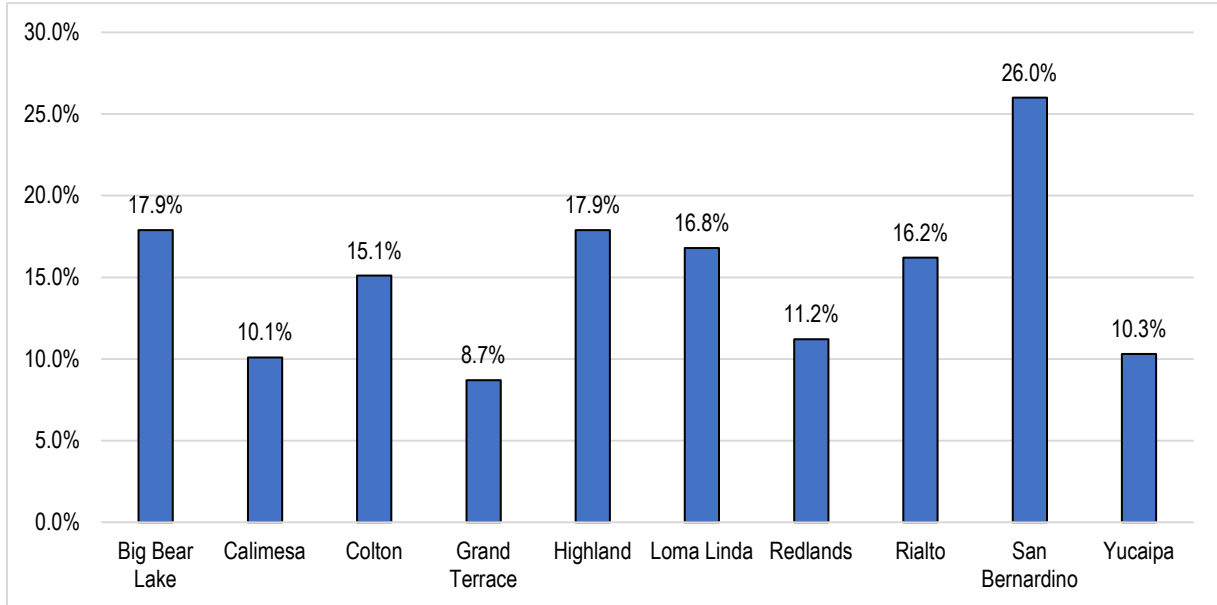

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population, 11.4% of the service area population have a disability. The service area city with the highest percentage of disabled residents is Calimesa (17.0%), as followed by Loma Linda (13.8%), Big Bear Lake (13.6%), Grand Terrace (12.8%), and San Bernardino (12.3%).

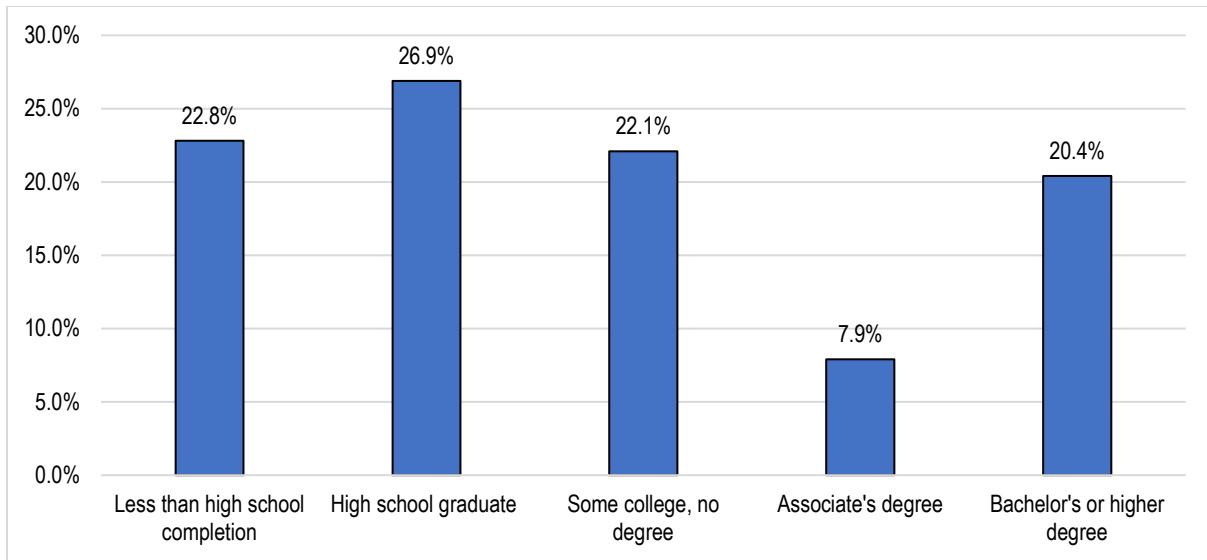

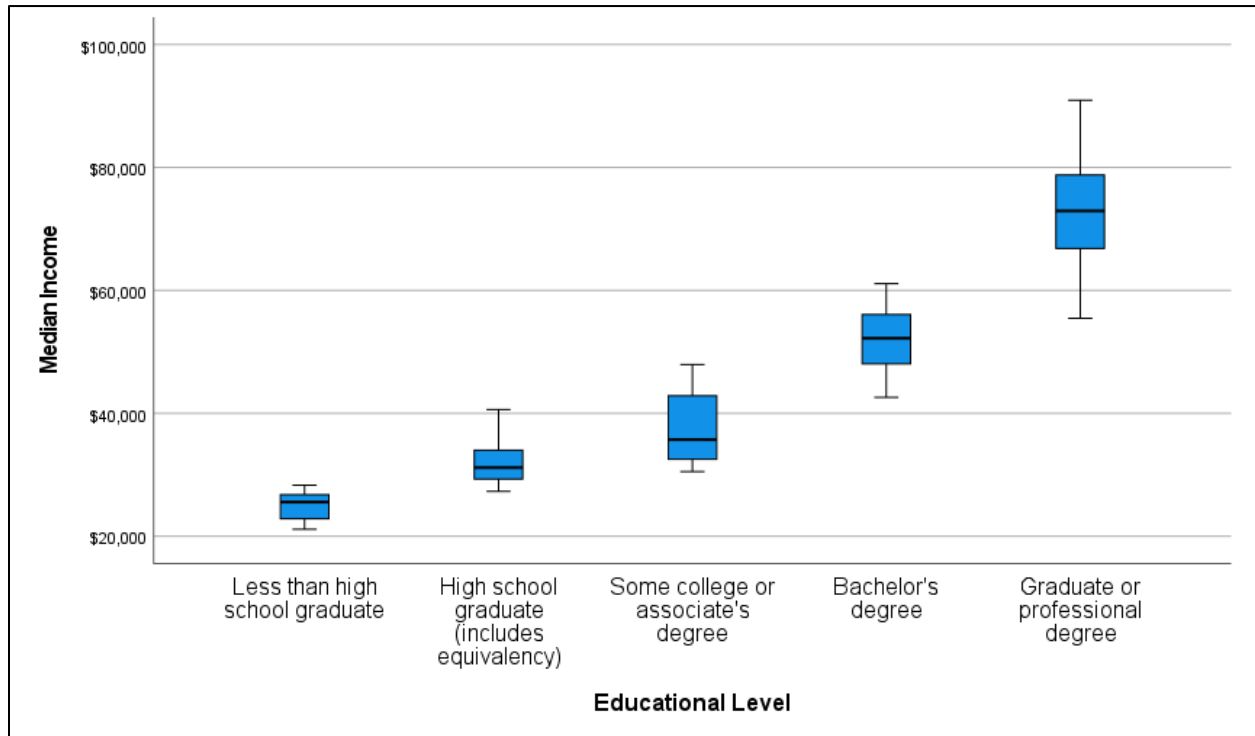

Among adults aged 25 and older, approximately fifty percent of the service area population have a high school diploma or lower, while 28.3 percent have a college degree (Associates degree or higher). Over 55 percent of the residents in Rialto (60.8%), San Bernardino (59.9%), and Colton (51.1%) have a high school diploma or have not completed High School. About 50% of the residents in Loma Linda (53.3%) and Redlands (50.6%) hold college degrees.

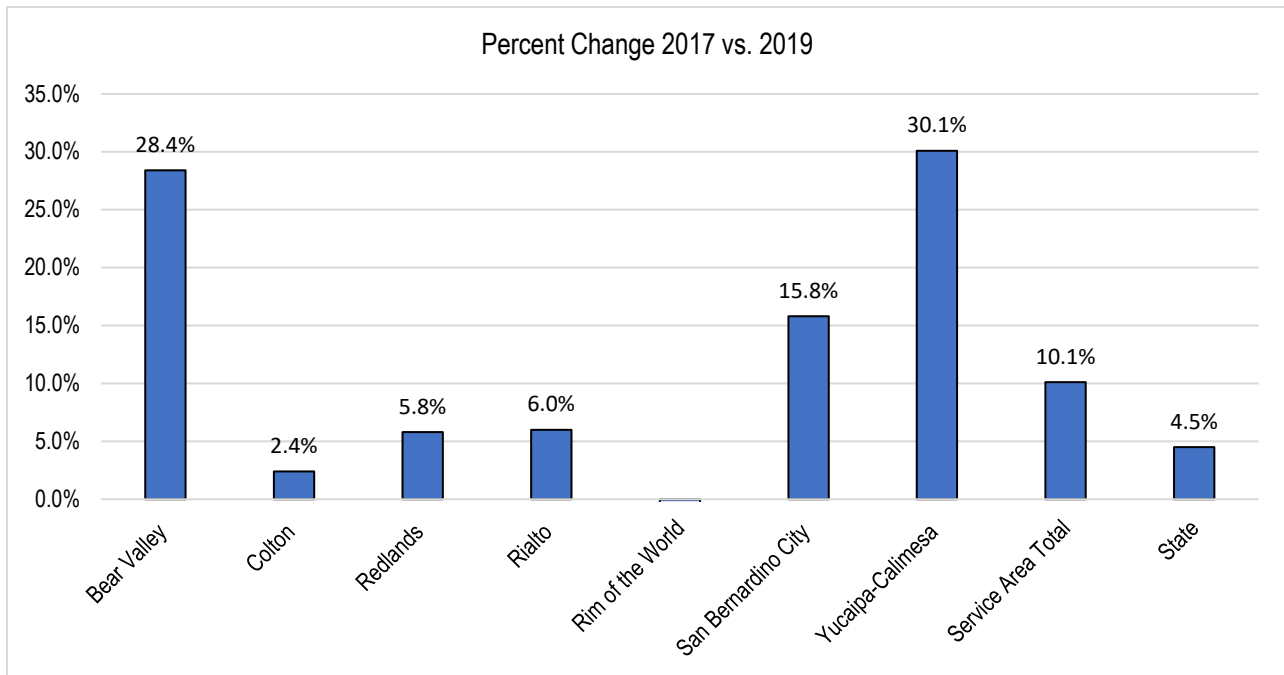

Educational attainment is strongly correlated with median incomes, per the Census Bureau's data. The median annual earning of the residents who hold a high school diploma or did not complete high school was lower than the residents who hold a college degree. The median annual earnings were different among the 10 service area cities. Redlands (\$48,032) and Yucaipa (\$45,966) had the highest median earnings, while San Bernardino (\$29,179), Big Bear Lake (\$30,768), and Rialto (\$32,239) had the lowest median earnings.

During the 2019-2020 Academic year, 9,463 students graduated from service area high schools. This was an increase of 869 students over the 2017-2019 academic year. Yucaipa-Calimesa Unified School District (30.1%) had the largest increase in the number of graduates. Bear Valley (28.4%), San Bernardino City (15.8%), Rialto (6.0%), Redlands (5.8%), and Colton (2.4%) Unified School Districts followed.

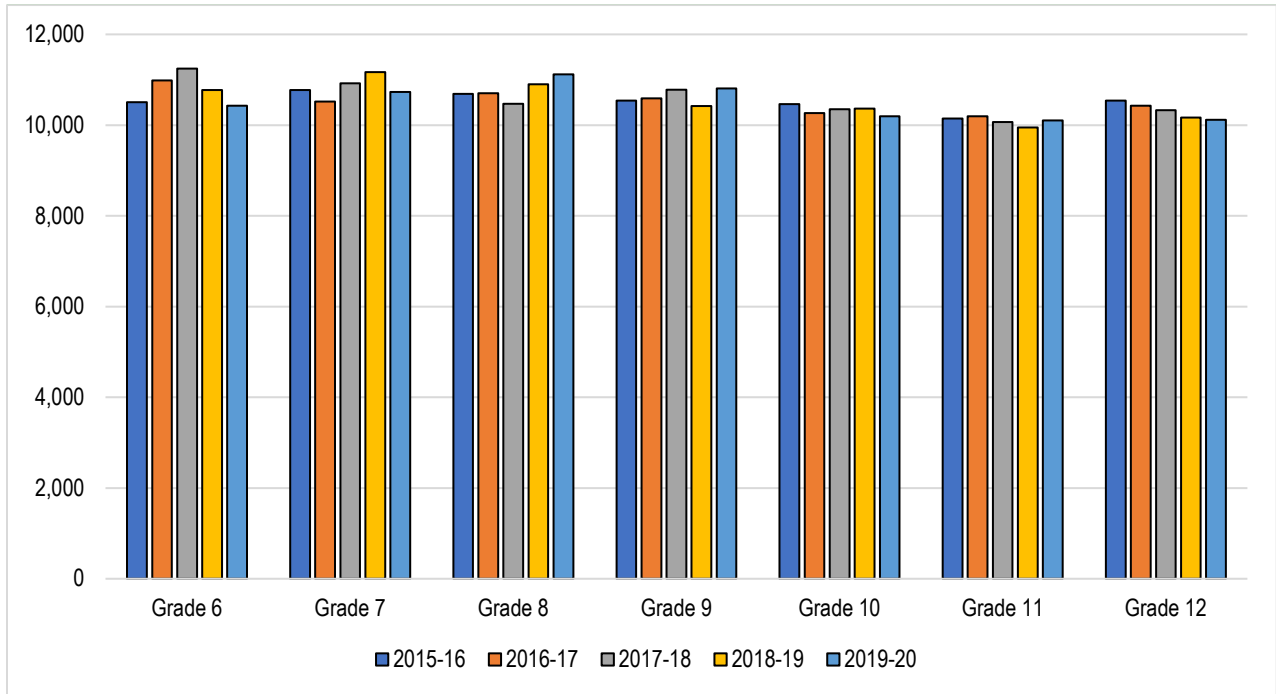

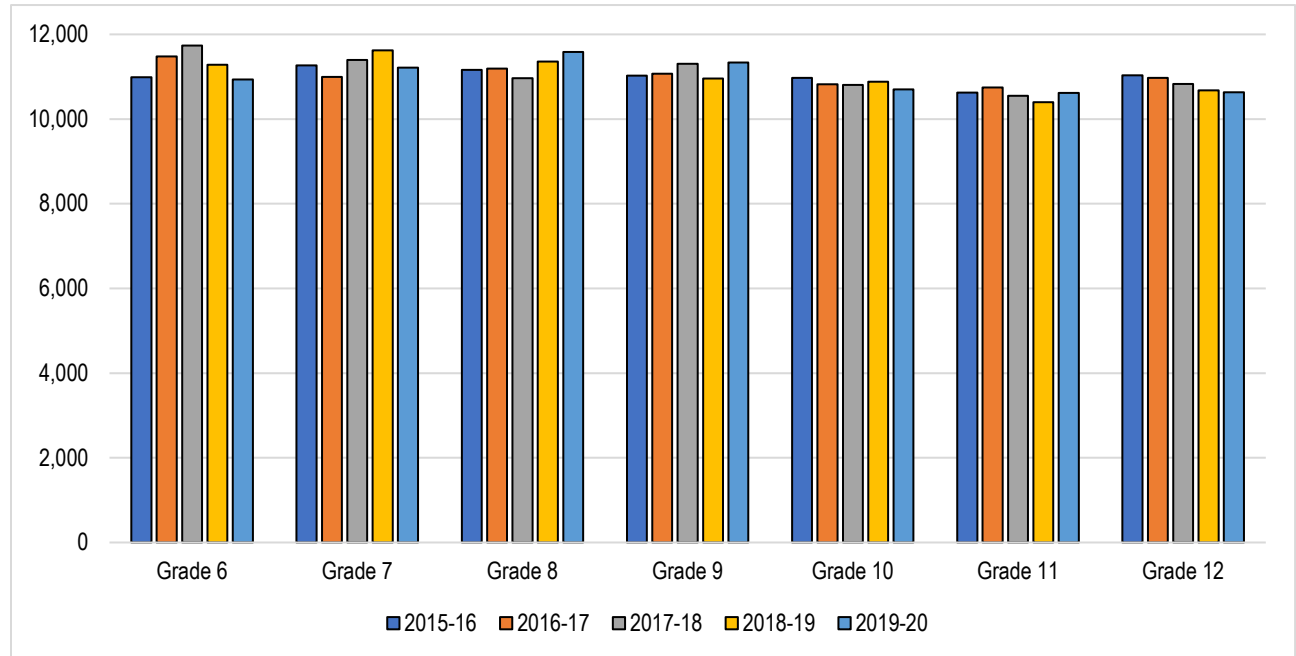
