



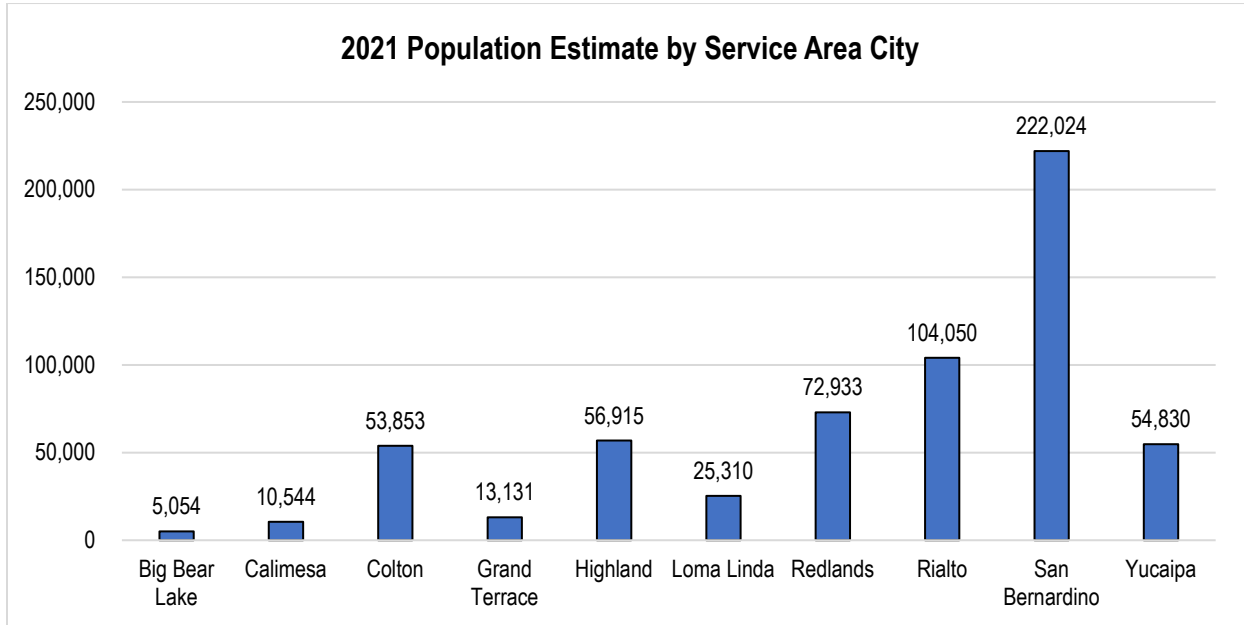

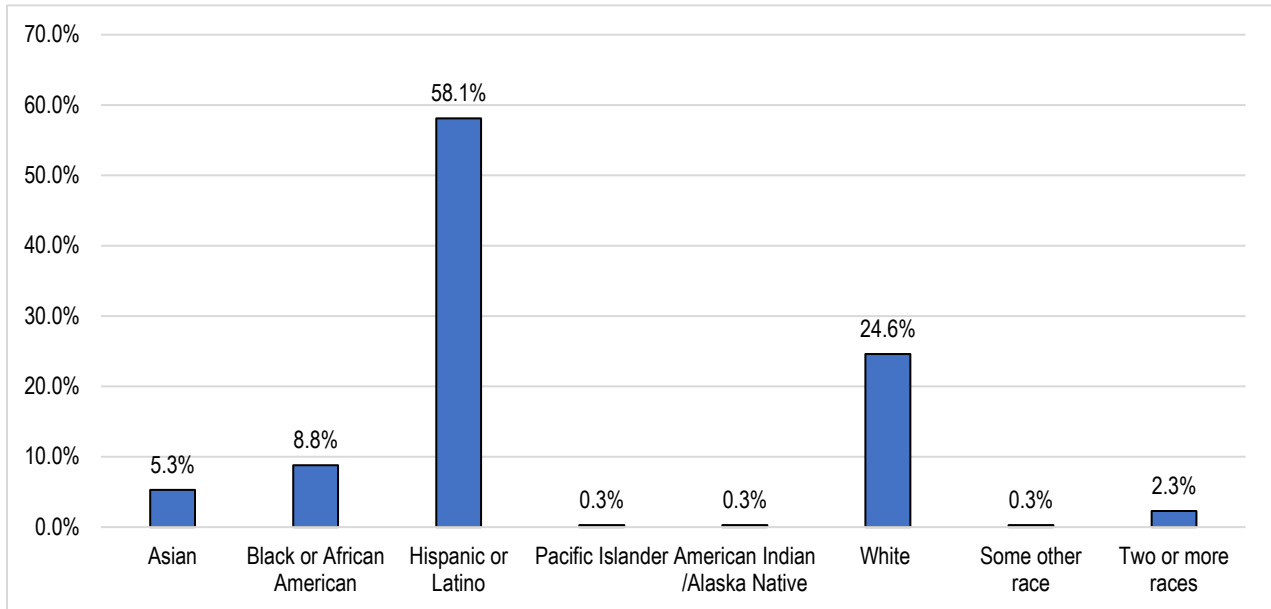

The San Bernardino Community College District service area represents 28.3% of the total San Bernardino County population. The top 3 cities – San Bernardino, Rialto, and Redlands represent about 64.5% of the service area population. The service area population grew by 6.2 percent to 618,644 between 2010 and 2021. Service area cities with the largest numeric growth were San Bernardino (+12,100), Rialto (+4,879), Redlands (+4,186), and Highland (+3,811). Fastest growing service area cities are Calimesa (33.8%), Grand Terrace (9.1%), Loma Linda (8.8%), and Highland (7.2%).

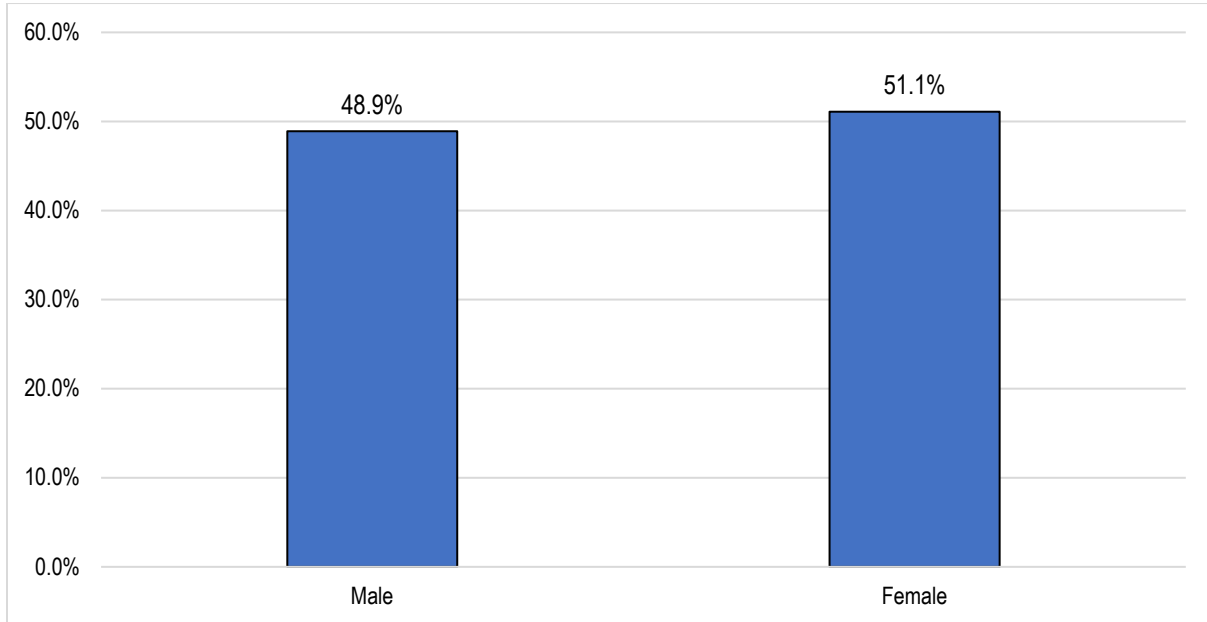

Ethnically, the population of the SBCCD service area cities is 58.1% Hispanic, 24.6% White, 8.8% African American, 5.3% Asian, 2.3% Two or More Race, 0.3% American Indians/Alaska Natives, 0.3% Pacific Islander, and 0.3% Some other race. In Rialto, Colton, and San Bernardino, more than 65% of the residents are Hispanic. In Big Bear Lake, Calimesa, and Yucaipa, more than 55% of the residents are White. In Loma Linda, 26.7% of the residents are Asian.

Gender Distribution : 2020

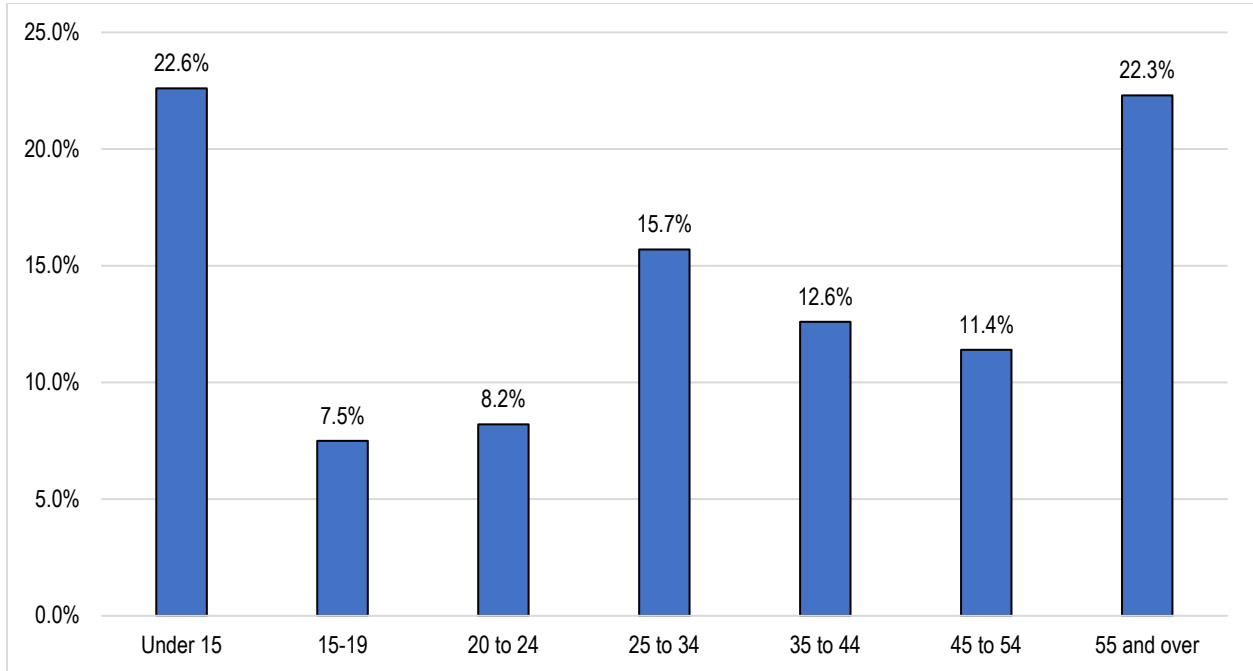

Currently, 51.1 percent of the SBCCD service area’s population is female and 48.9 percent is male. In 2 cities, there is a slightly higher number of females than males. The service area city with the largest female population is Loma Linda (54.7%), followed by Redlands (52.7%), and Grand Terrace (52.5%).

Age Range Distribution: 2020



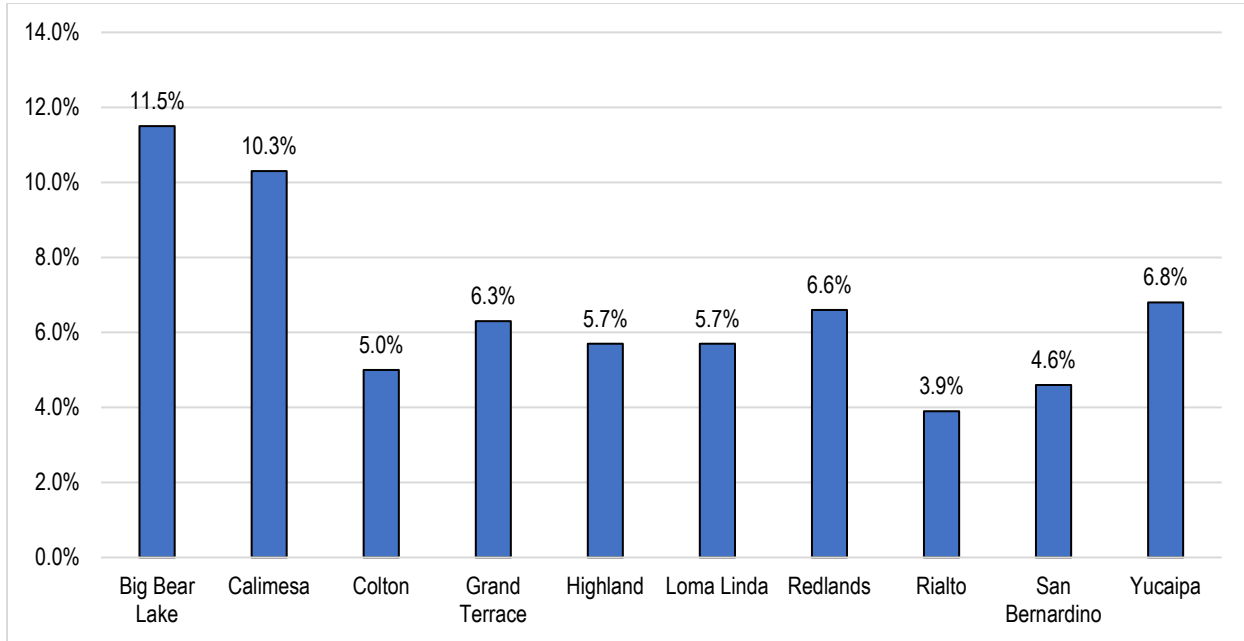

The two largest age groups in the SBCCD’s service Area cities are residents under 15 years of age (22.2%) and residents 55 years of age or older (22.4%). Together these ages groups make up nearly 46.9% of the service area population. The median age in the SBCCD service area population is 36.3 years old, which is older than the county’s median age.

The median age in Calimesa is the highest in the service area at 44.5 years. Big Bear’s median age of 40.6 years is the next highest. Riato had the lowest median age (30.7 years), followed by San Bernardino (30.9 years).

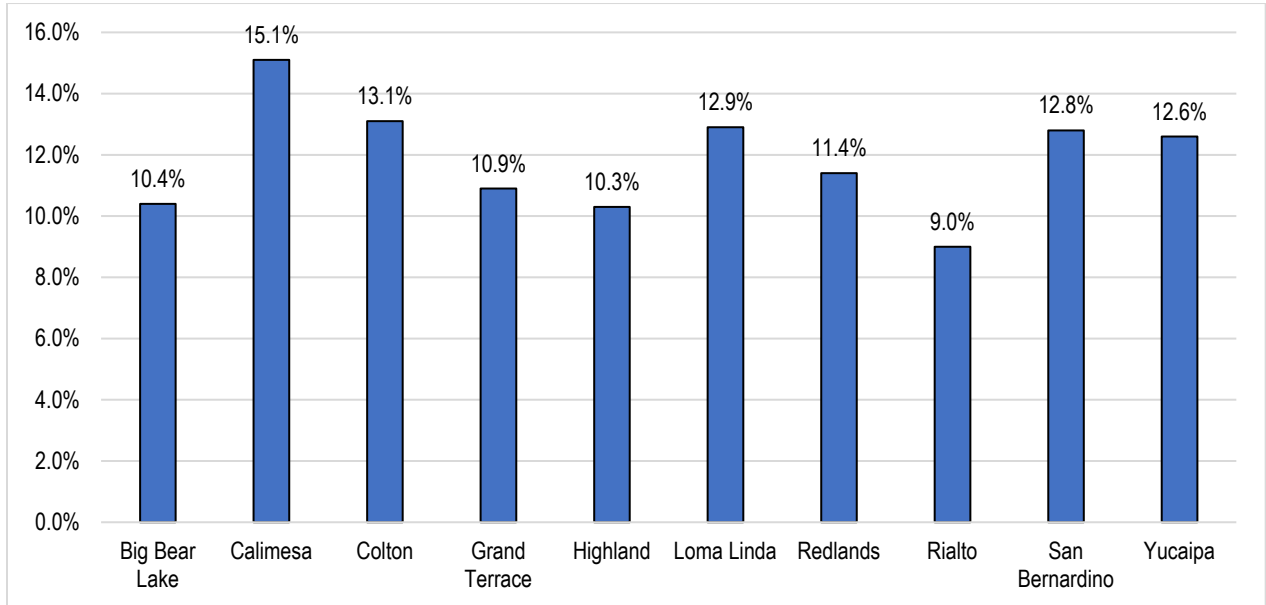

Among the civilian population 18 years and older, 5.3 percent of the service area population are veterans, which is higher than the state's percentage (5.0%). The service area city with the highest percentage of veterans is Calimesa (11.1%). Big Bear Lake (9.0%), Grand Terrace (7.5%), and Redlands (6.5%) follow.

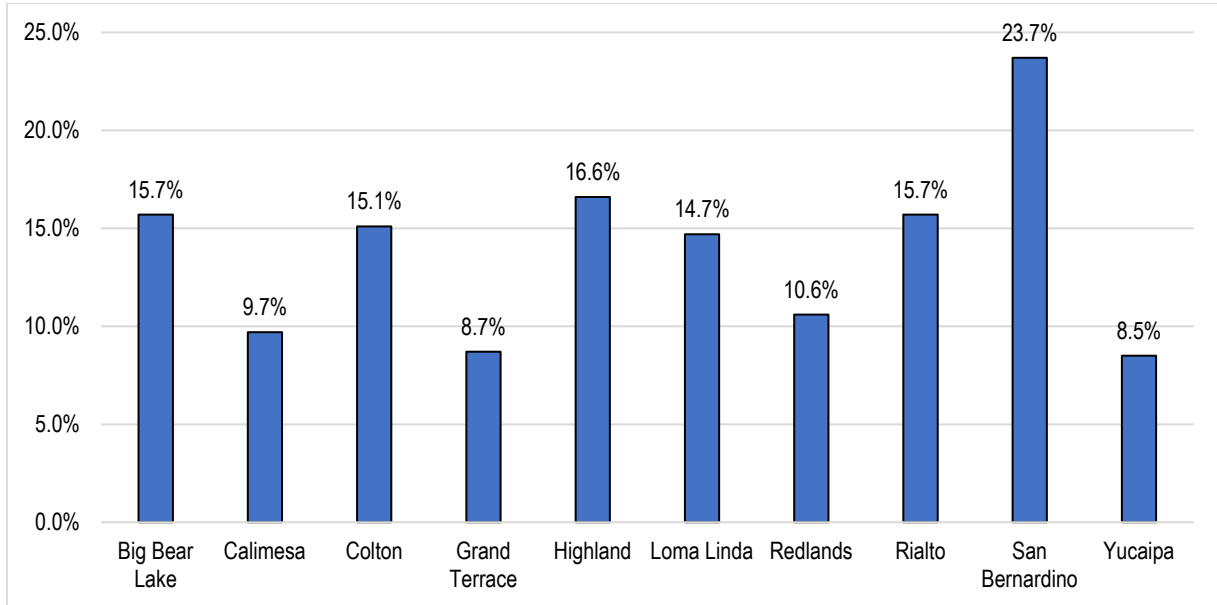

Among the civilian noninstitutionalized population, 11.7% of the service area population have a disability. The service area city with the highest percentage of disabled residents is Calimesa (15.1%), as followed by Colton (13.1%), Loma Linda (12.9%), San Bernardino (12.8%), and Yucaipa (12.6%).

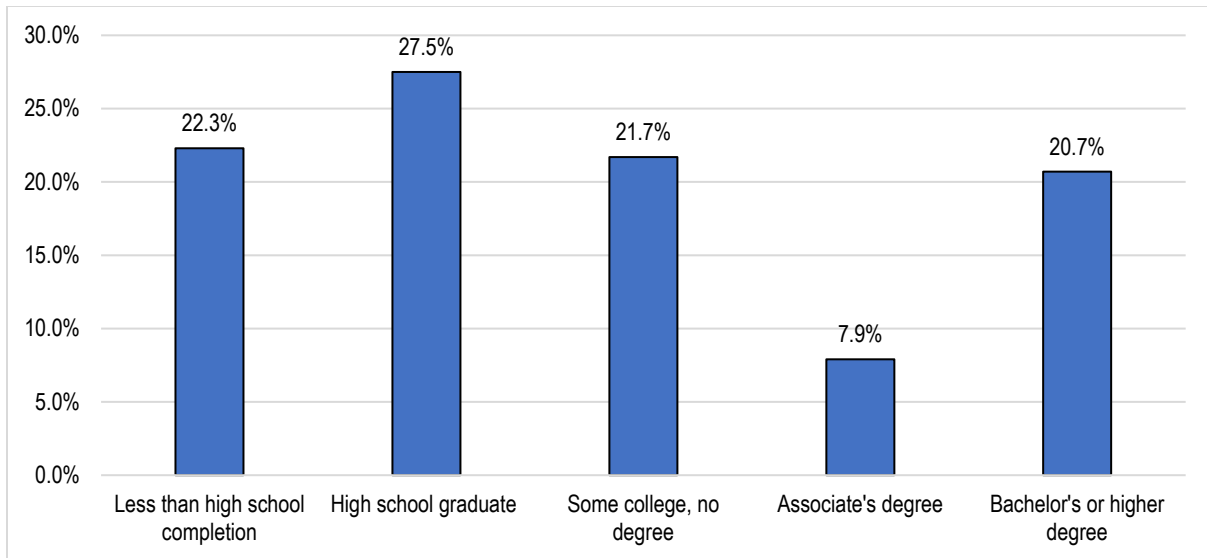

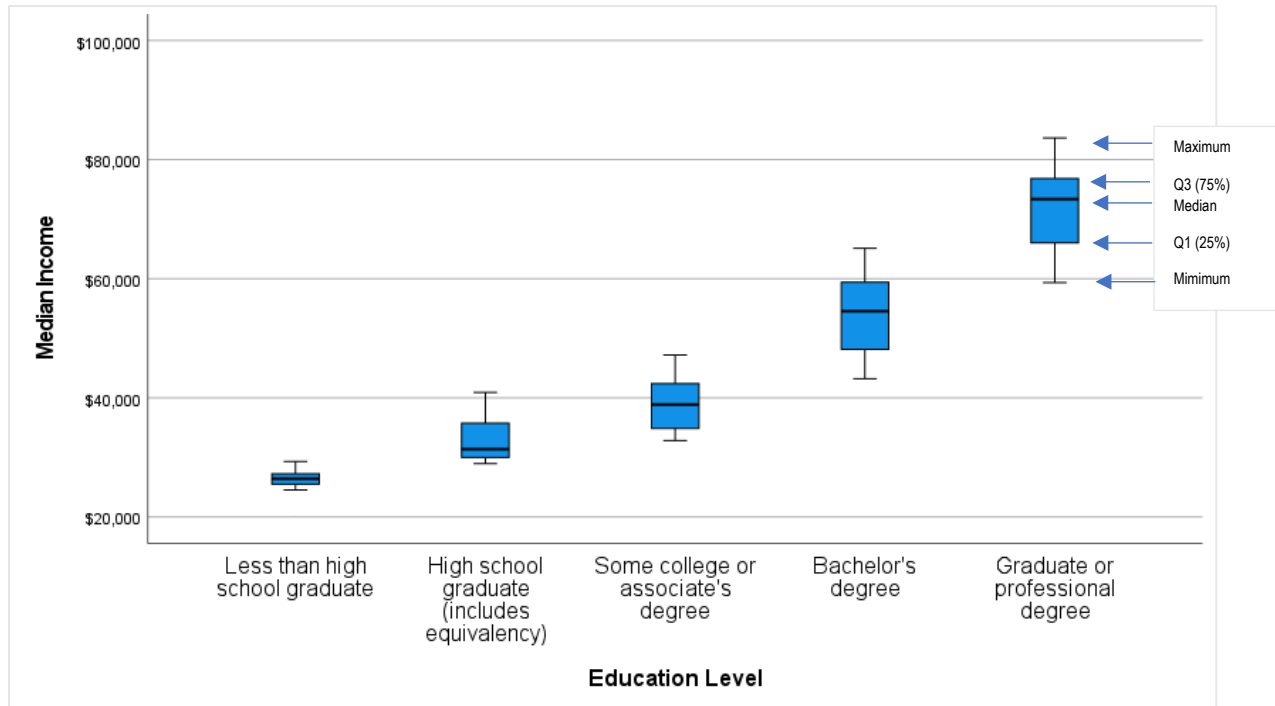

Among adults aged 25 and older, approximately fifty percent of the service area population have a high school diploma or lower, while 28.6 percent have a college degree (Associates degree or higher). Over 55 percent of the residents in Rialto (59.6%), San Bernardino (59.8%), and Colton (53.2%) have a high school diploma or have not completed High School. About 50% of the residents in Loma Linda (56.4%) and Redlands (50.8%) hold college degrees.

Median Annual Earnings by Educational Attainment, Population 25 Years and Over with Earnings

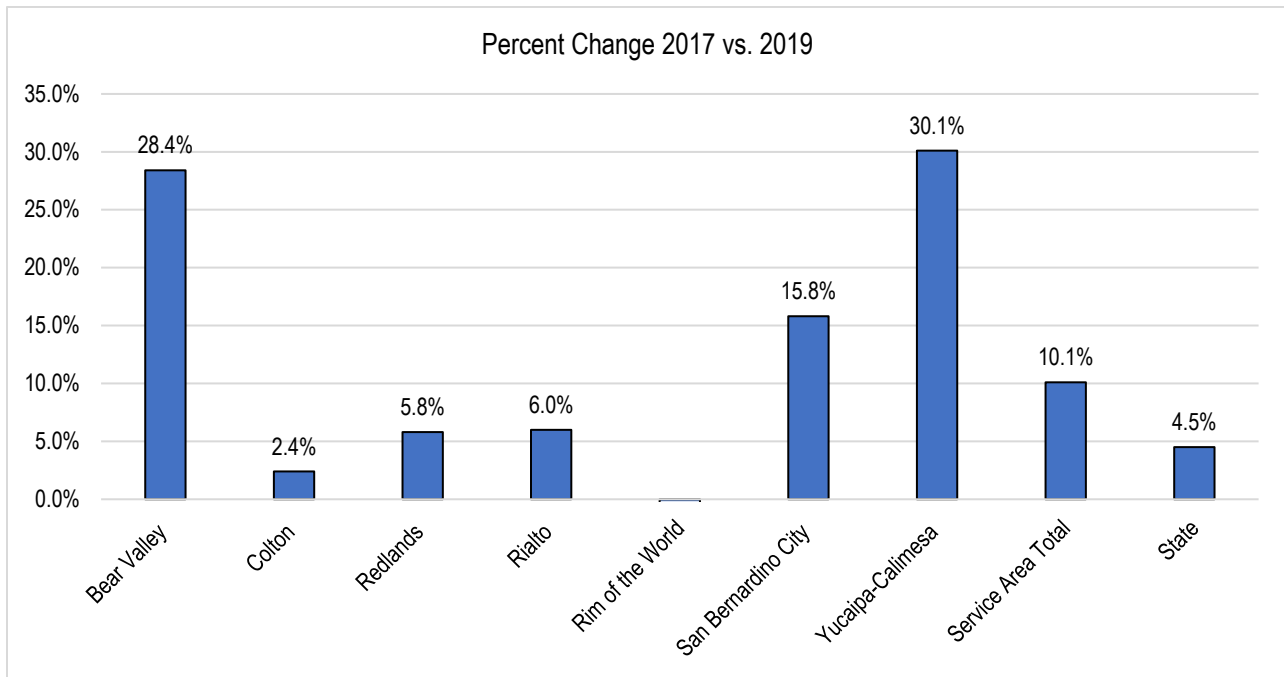

The box plots above show the summary of the minimum income, first quartile, median, third quartile, and maximum income for each education level. Educational attainment is strongly correlated with median incomes, per the Census Bureau’s data. The median annual earning of the residents who hold a high school diploma or did not complete high school was lower than the residents who hold a college degree. The median annual earnings were different among the 10 service area cities. Redlands (\$49,923) and Yucaipa (\$47,755) had the highest median earnings, while San Bernardino (\$30,870), and Rialto (\$33,626) had the lowest median earnings.

During the 2019-2020 Academic year, 9,463 students graduated from service area high schools. This was an increase of 869 students over the 2017-2019 academic year. Yucaipa-Calimesa Unified School District (30.1%) had the largest increase in the number of graduates. Bear Valley (28.4%), San Bernardino City (15.8%), Rialto (6.0%), Redlands (5.8%), and Colton (2.4%) Unified School Districts followed.

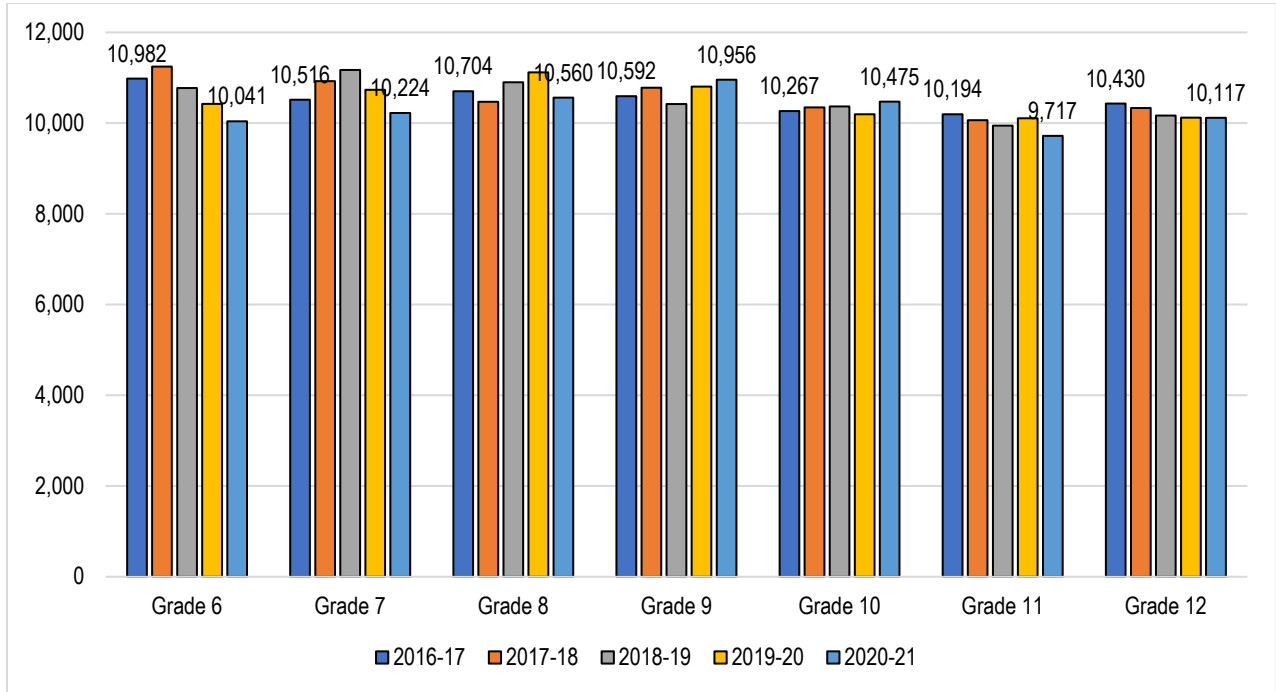

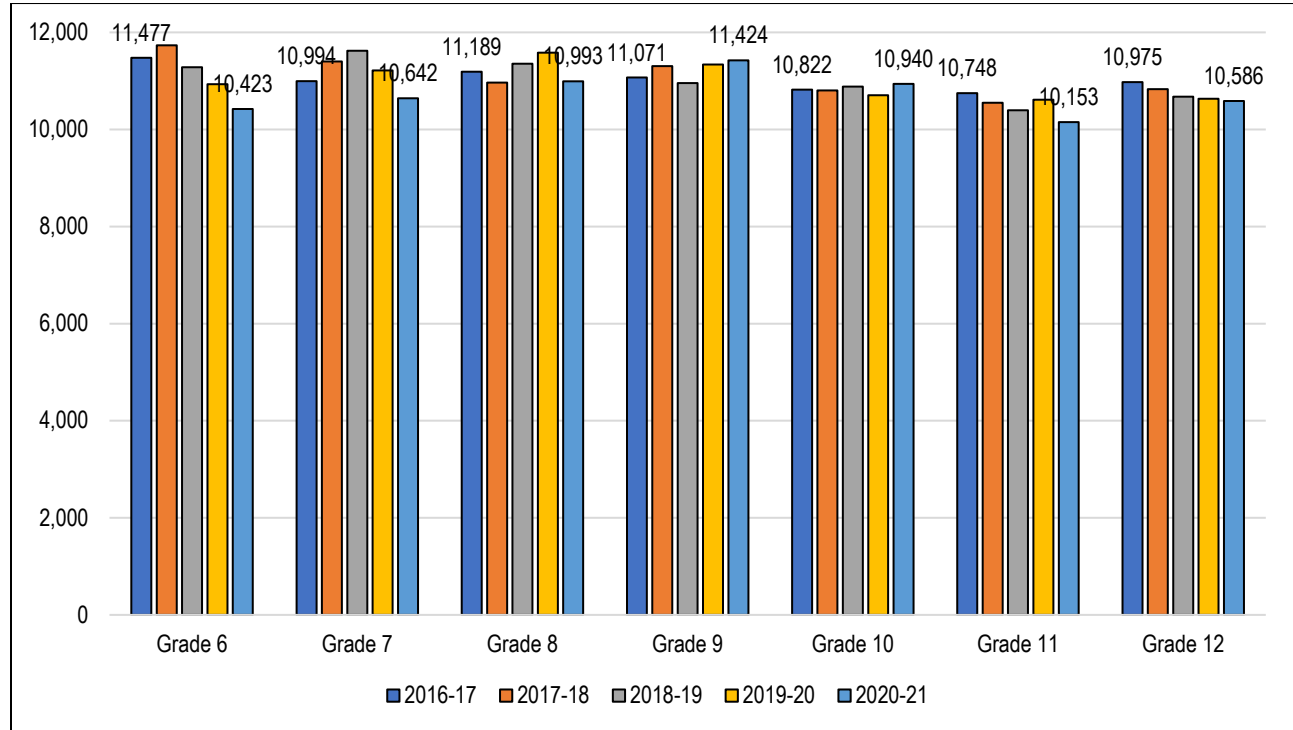
